

# a message from OUR ELDER CHAİR

### Leadership

It's that time in the year for Central Park Christian Church to begin making our plans for next year's leadership. The current board of elders would like to thank each one of you for your support, encouragement, and steadfastness throughout this last year. CPCC members are encouraged to make nominations for the board of elders, the deacons, and the deaconesses. Biblical qualifications for each position will be made available for everyone on the table in the foyer and nominations will be accepted through Sunday, October 27th. At that time, nominations will be affirmed and a formal list of each nomination will be made available November 10th so everyone can view the list, pray, and prepare for the official vote during our annual congregational meeting on Sunday, December 8th. All terms will begin January 1st, 2025, and will be held for one year. In order to serve as an elder, deacon, or deaconess, CPCC requires that person to have placed their membership at CPCC.

We ask you to prayerfully consider not only who to nominate for what position, we also ask that you seek the Lord in prayer and see where He wants you to serve next year in support of CPCC. For me, it is more than an honor. I truly feel called to serve as an elder. In 1 Peter 5:2-3 elders are called to be an example to the flock they are serving. I hope I have been able to do that well over this last year. We started off with a great deal of challenges and ran into several more along the way. We still face challenges we are not even remotely aware of, but we can take courage for sure. In Matthew 16:18, Jesus declares that the gates of hell will not prevail over His church. To kick off the night we were reminded of lessons we can learn from sunflowers:

#### Sunflowers seek and follow the sun

It's known that young sunflowers follow the sun. Even on overcast days, the sunflower will seek out the light shining through the clouds. They reset each night and prepare to face the sun again each new day. Similarly, we should be seeking out and focusing on the Son. As young sunflowers easily face the sun, typically so do new Christians. With the excitement of finding lesus it's easier to look to Him!

#### Sunflowers have to be well grounded

Sunflowers grow tall and bear much weight, so it's important that they are well supported. Their roots must be strong and deep. Like them, we must be deeply rooted in God's truth through His word. Our roots flourish when we are planted in rich soil, allowing us to stand in the truth of His Word.

#### Sunflowers get weighted down as they mature

Sometimes, through hardships, we can produce the most productive fruit for His kingdom.

### Sunflowers reflect the sun

Sunflowers are known for being bright and cheerful and reminders of the sun. Likewise, we should also be reflections of the Son, and the better we know Him and are grounded in Him, the more we will resemble Him.

Friends, may we continually allow God to nourish our roots while we seek to focus on, and reflect Him.

### **RAN:** Christians Arrested as Muslims turn to Christ

In September, a young woman died while in custody of the Iranian religious police, leading to a spontaneous uprising. Since the woman's death, front-line workers have reported an increase in Iranian Muslims turning to Christ, even as their government has increased its persecution of Christians.

In a series of arrests in May, agents of the Islamic Revolutionary Court searched the homes of three Christian women for several hours before confiscating their personal belongings and taking the women to an unknown location. The three Christian women were held for 40 days in Evin Prison before being allowed to contact their families. Two months later, nearly 60 Iranian Christians were arrested across the county.

A front-line worker who ministers in Iran through Christian satellite television said the young woman's death has caused many Iranians to become even more disillusioned with their repressive Islamic government, leading them to search for truth elsewhere. Though the internet is highly restricted and monitored, satellite television broadcasts are not, and many are learning about Christ through these broadcasts.

"We have registered more salvations in the last three years than in the last 20," the front-line worker said.

SUNDAY MORNINGS AT 9:30




