International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church (IDOP)

Christian persecution is on the rise world over. Today, more than 317 million Christians live in places where they face high levels of persecution. In many parts of the world, every day, Christians are harassed, discriminated against, wrongfully imprisoned, and even killed because of their faith. According to the World Watch List for Christian Persecution, over 4,900 people were killed in 2024 because of their faith in Jesus. This is a staggering number!

The Bible tells us that everyone who desires to live a godly life will be persecuted (2 Timothy 3:12). However, this is not the complete story. In the Bible, Jesus says that: "In this world, you will have trouble, but take heart, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). Persecution, therefore, is not a defeat for the believer!

IDOP is an annual, global event to pray for the persecuted Church. Let's unite in prayer on November 3rd and ask the Holy Spirit to enable those persecuted to stand firm in their faith and be obedient to Christ, even as they serve Him through many hardships. Pray they Stand Firm!

Shalom.

As November rolls in, I am reminded of just how beautiful God's plan truly is. His will and His plan is always better than anything my finite mind can conceive of or hope for. That said, there have been times in my life when anxiety creeps in and fear grips my heart. Something I have become aware of is my obligation as a father. It is my duty to provide things like food, heat, shelter, cold and hot water, clothes, and the list goes on and on. At times, it has become a source of anxiety and fear; however, God has blessed myself and my family abundantly.

A recent example of God's blessing happened in October. One morning, I checked our bank account expecting my paycheck would be there, but it wasn't. I quickly learned the bank was having technical difficulties and it was going to take a couple of extra days for my paycheck to be available. However, God blessed us with His perfect timing. Our request for food stamp assistance was approved and we were able to buy groceries while we were waiting for the bank to remedy their technical situation. When I find myself in an overwhelming, anxiety inducing situation, I always remember what God says in His word.

There is something about the act of acknowledging God and His blessings. When giving thanks to Him, any fear or anxiety I feel may disperse from my presence. When I count all God's blessings and provisions, there is an enormous pile stacked so high that my fear and anxiety disappear. God is good all the time. All the time God is good."

God promises He will give us His peace if we present our requests to Him with thanksgiving. God's word says this in Philippians 4:6-7/

Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your request be made known to God; and the peace of God which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.





Neighborhook blessing box

Did you know we have a "Blessing Box" here in the CPCC neighborhood? Located at Mary Flin's house (also our community Chaplain House), it is the cross-shaped "box" at the edge of the porch/sidewalk at 911 SW 16th.

On your way to or from church, donations of sandwiches, snacks, pantry items... pretty much anything...can be placed in the box. Clothes, blankets, coats, etc. can be put in the black crates on either side of the cross.

Items needing to be refrigerated can be "porch-dropped" and donors can text Mary at 785-431-6000 to let her know.

We have at least two neighbors who regularly help others with access to food, and if Mary gets too much, she passes it on to another. Everything gets used. The box will almost always look empty because folks are welcome to take anytime, and it has proven to be a blessing a number of times. Please contact Mary with questions.

Despite the abuse, Goma does not want to leave the Lord. 
