Rough around the edges

Luke 2:8-11: And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, “Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.”

This Christmas season, the story of the shepherds really stood out to me because it seems so relatable to Central Park Christian Church. Let’s face it, we aren’t a crowd of rich kings and wise men – we’re normal folks, and a lot of us have been through tough circumstances. We’re people in recovery from trauma, broken marriages, addictions, and bad choices. We’re rough around the edges, and we don’t wear fancy clothes or sing songs in four-part harmony with our hands neatly folded. Some of us even live outdoors.

That’s the kind of people the shepherds were. They, too, were rough around the edges, lacking social graces because they spent all their time with animals. They were in an occupation that wasn’t respected. They were even dirty and smelly. In short, they were the kind of folks that “good” Christians would have a tendency to look down upon.

But we see in this story that the shepherds had hearts that were in tune with God, aware of His promises, and ready to worship! So, when it was time for the arrival of the Savior to be proclaimed to the world, the angel was sent first to these lowly shepherds who were keeping watch over their flock out in a dark and lonely field. God gave them the high privilege of being the first recipients of this astounding news, and He blessed them by letting them be the audience for a choir of angels. Naturally, then, their hearts were filled with great joy and they took off with “great haste” to see the new-born Messiah.

Leadership

As we turn the calendars into January and think about what normally comes with starting a new year, we have an extra level of excitement for CPCC this year. We are grateful that our God has seen us through this last year along with all the challenges we have encountered, we have been able to rely on God to see us through each one. We know that adversity grows our faith and we are highly anticipating what marvelous things God will be doing in this coming year through CPCC. Faith is an amazing thing. Scripture tells us we are saved by grace through faith, and faith does not come from ourselves but it too, is a gift of God. Ephesians 2:8

Romans 10:17 teaches us that faith comes from hearing the Word of God. “Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the Word of Christ.” So I turn to God’s Word knowing His Word is eternal, and true. self-control and to self-control, perseverance, and to perseverance, godliness, and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being inefficient and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But if anyone does not have them, he is nearsighted and blind, and has forgotten that he has been cleansed from this past sins. Therefore, my brothers, be all the more eager to make your calling and election sure. For if you do these things, you will never fall, and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Jesus, help us in our unbelief. That's my prayer for all of us. In turning the calendar, I am reminded of another way in which God's sovereignty is made known among the nations. Knowing a day is determined by the earth's rotation, a month is generally determined by the moon's rotation around the earth, and a year is determined by the earth's rotation around the sun; I am always amazed at how the whole world has a seven day week with nothing to mark off a week other than what our God established by resting on the seventh day, thus establishing a week. Even other non-Christian religions and worldly governments follow an established seven day week. It's all for the glory of God.

Neighborhood blessing box

Did you know we have a “Blessing Box” here in the CPCC neighborhood? Located at Mary Flin’s house (also our community Chaplain House), it is the cross-shaped “box” at the edge of the porch/sidewalk at 911 SW 16th.

On your way to or from church, donations of sandwiches, snacks, pantry items... pretty much anything...can be placed in the box. Clothes, blankets, coats, etc. can be put in the black crates on either side of the cross.

Items needing to be refrigerated can be “porch-dropped” and donors can text Mary at 785-431-6000 to let her know.

We have at least two neighbors who regularly help others with access to food, and if Mary gets too much, she passes it on to another. Everything gets used. The box will almost always look empty because folks are welcome to take anytime, and it has proven to be a blessing a number of times. Please contact Mary with questions.

Nigeria: *Rebekah*

As Rebekah stood on a hill just outside her Nigerian village one hot day, she could do nothing but watch as her house and church burned to the ground.

She and her neighbors were devastated at the sight of their village in flames and helpless to defend themselves against the heavily armed Boko Haram militants who had caused the destruction. But for Rebekah, that wasn't the worst of it; she later learned that her husband and a son had been killed in the attack.

Seven months after Rebekah's life was so radically altered by the Islamist attack, Nigerian military forces pushed Boko Haram out of the region. Though the destruction was widespread, government authorities allowed Rebekah and the other villagers to return to the charred remains of their homes to reclaim what was left. As she sifted through the ashes, Rebekah's heart filled with hope at the discovery of her burned but still usable Bible.

She bent over, carefully picked it up and brushed away the ashes. "Thank you, Lord," she sighed.

Although parts of Genesis and Revelation were burned, the rest of her Bible survived intact. As she continued to mourn the loss of her husband, a son, her home and her church, the charred Bible was a source of great comfort.

"Each time I open my Bible during my studies, it reminds me of God's faithfulness," she said. "Seeing the ashes of some [pages] I could no longer read makes God's Word more alive in my heart."

Rebekah still chooses to use her burned Bible today. While a new one would be nice, her tattered copy has gotten her through some difficult times. It's the Bible her church gave her when she and her husband married, and it's the Bible they read to their children every day.

Despite the damage caused by fire, Rebekah clings to her treasured copy of God's Living Word and is grateful that it survived the Boko Haram attack.

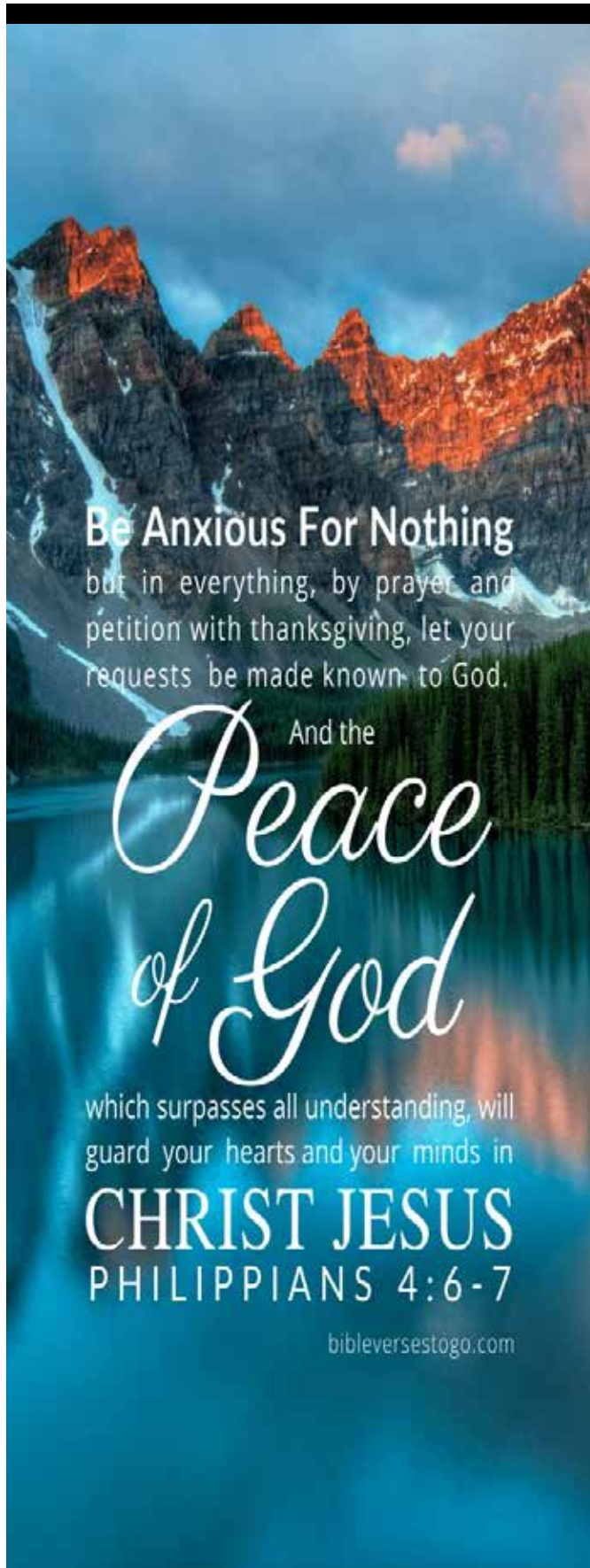
